Executive Board Meetings

Vice President Honigsberg provided an overview of the executive board meetings that have occurred since the June meeting. Vice President Honigsberg reported the executive board has discussed the following topics: monthly financial, dues structure, website update, communications, and evaluator training, test dates and locations.

Written and Practical test Update.

Secretary Mary Germershausen reported there were 3 administrations of the written examination in 2008; 27 applicants sat for the examination with 18 successfully completing the examination. During 2008 there were five practical examinations for the kit certification examination. A total of 25 applicants participated in the practical examination with 11 successfully completing the examination thus becoming certified cable splicers. As of November 1, 2008 there are 59 NCSCB certified splicers.

Secretary Germershausen reported the written examination will be administered on the following dates in 2009:

January 10th – McDean, Northern Virginia; February 6th – Tidewater Virginia (application cut –off December 19th) February 7th - Providence, RI (application cut –off December 19th) May 1st – Tidewater, Virginia (application cut –off March 27th) May 2nd – Providence, Rhode Island (application cut –off March 27th)

The Kit Certification Practical examination will be administered on the following dates in 2009:

January 24th – Providence Rhode Island April 24th – Tidewater, Virginia July 11th – Tidewater, Virginia

Treasurer Iacobellis made the following recommendations:

- Increase the written test fee to from \$245 to \$295.
- Failure to report for the written examination the applicants forfeits 50% of the exam fee.
- If an applicant fails the written examination and applies for a retest the applicant will pay 50% of the test fee, unless more than 10 are scheduled for the next exam date in the same locations and space is available at the test location.

After much discussion by the board members, the following motion was made by Treasurer Iacobellis and seconded by Jereme Wilson:

Remove the wording: \$50 application fee and increase the written examination fee from \$245 dollars to \$295 dollars. Increase the recertification fee from \$50 to \$100 dollars. The motion was moved without objection.

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Failure to appear at a written exam and retest fee

The board discussed the absenteeism issue with applicants who have applied and have submitted payment for the written examination. After much discussion by board members, a motion was made by Bob Baird and seconded by Kory Schindler. In the event that an applicant fails to appear for the written examination, they will forfeit the \$295 application fee. If an applicant fails the examination fee, the retest fee will be \$200. The new fee will become effective, for any new applicants as of 1/1/2009. Anyone already in the system will be held to the existing price structure. This language shall be added to the application on the website and will also state the NCSCB Inc will not refund funds for failure to appear at the examination.

After much discussion by the board members the following motion was made by Vice President John Honigsberg and seconded by Treasurer Mike Iacobellis:

The annual fee for an **Associate** membership will be \$150.00; the annual fee for an **Individual** membership will be \$250.00. The following entities qualify for individual membership (Utilities, Engineers, Contractors, Cable Splicers and Public at Large. The annual fee for **Manufacturer/Organization** members will be \$1500.00 per year. The following entities qualify for Manufacturer/Organization membership (manufacturers of cable, medium voltage splicing and terminating technology, and equipment; and the following organizations NECA, IBEW, IEC, NJATC and NETA). The motion passed without objection.

Practical Examination Fee Increase

Treasurer Mike Iacobellis proposed the following increase for the practical examination. The fee increase will cover the cost of the materials, evaluators and administrators expenses, travel and hotel. The breakdown is as follows:

Materials 3 kits	\$ 225.00(Does not include shipping materials to sites or cable
Evaluator #1 – 1.5 days	\$ 600.00(\$400.00 per day)
Evaluator #2 – 1.5 days	\$ 600.00(\$400.00 per day)

Administrator – 2 days	\$ 800.00(Set-up testing site, paperwork, and breakdown test site
Travel	\$1500.00
Hotel Accommodations'	\$ 900.00

Proposed new practical test fee for the kit certification = \$725.00

The twenty-five percent overhead and profit includes the loan payment of forty dollars, credit card fee of eighteen dollars, certificate and card cost of ten dollars. This will leave a balance of seventy-seven dollars which will be applied to the overall operational expenses to include shipping of materials.

After much discussion by the board, President Anderson appointed a Practical Exam Cost committee to review the fee structure for the kit certification practical examination. Bob Baird was appointed Chairman of the committee. The following board members volunteered to work on the committee: Dale Merson, Glenn Wilson and Mike Iacobellis. The committee will provide the executive committee with a detailed cost analysis for the kit certification practical examination before the end of the year.

Communications

President Anderson requested that anyone who is not receiving the electronic newsletter should provide Communications Officer Carley Abner with their contact information. Carley provided the board with an overview of the electronic newsletter and requested topics for articles, installation tips or photographs of installations.
